Present Continuous with a future meaning

We can use the **present continuous** to talk about arrangements (plans which you have organised) in the future (jövőre tervezett cselekvések).

My brother **is playing** football with his friends tonight.

↑
present continuous

↑
future time expression

I'm going to the cinema at the weekend.

Are you having a party next Saturday?

Time expressions used with present continuous:	
to talk about future plans (jövőbeli tervek) <ul style="list-style-type: none">- this afternoon, tomorrow morning, next week, in two years, etc. <i>I'm playing football tomorrow afternoon.</i>	to talk about actions in progress (folyamatban levő cselekvések) <ul style="list-style-type: none">- now, right now, at the moment <i>I'm playing football now.</i>

Time expressions used with present continuous:

- **to talk about future plans** (jövőbeli tervek): this afternoon, tomorrow morning, next week, in two years, etc.
- **to talk about actions in progress** (folyamatban levő cselekvések): now, right now, at the moment
