

# How to use 'Modal Verbs'

CAN = Ability, Request

COULD = Past ability, Suggestion

MAY = Permission, future possibility

Might = Present Or future possibility

MUST = Necessity, obligation

OUGHT TO = What's right and correct (do.)

SHALL = Offer, Suggestion

SHOULD = Advice, Prediction

WILL = Willingness, Prediction, promise

WOULD = Request, Invitation

# Must

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**Obligation** : You must complete the work by Friday. (present)

You had to complete the work by Friday. (past)

**Logical necessity** : Parents must accompany children under ten.  
(rules)

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# Ought to

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**Obligation** : You ought to see a doctor.

(ought to and should are less forceful than must.)

**Probability** : Helen has been studying hard for the exam, so she ought to pass.

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# May

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Permission : May I come in? (asking)  
You may go now. (giving)  
(more polite than can)

Possibility : He may become the next  
(factual) Mr. America. (fact)  
Any boy can become Mr.  
World. (idea)

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# Might

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Possibility : I might become Manager  
(remote) next year.

Permission : Might I smoke here?  
(rarely used)
