## **Order of Adjectives**

When we use more than one adjective before a noun in English, we often put the adjectives in a specific order.

However, there are two things to remember:

- First, it's very rare to use more than three adjectives before a noun.
- > Second, sometimes the order can be changed, usually to emphasise something.

The order of the adjectives are as follows:

- 1. Opinion: pretty, horrible, lovely
- 2. Size: huge, tiny, big, little
- 3. Age: old, young, new
- 4. Shape: round, square, triangular
- 5. Colour: black, red, yellow
- 6. Origin: British, Chinese, French
- 7. Material: woollen, wooden, silk
- 8. Purpose: writing (paper), school (shoes)

The first letter of these words spell 'OSASCOMP' and this is a great way to remember the order of adjectives.

Here are some examples:

- I bought a small black handbag.
- That is a really ugly wooden chair.
- There is a new Chinese student in the class.
- We sold some old French paintings.
- We bought a new round kitchen table.
- She was wearing a new red silk dress.

## Types of Adjectives (OSASCOMP)

Opinion Examples: funny, beautiful, fabulous, difficult Size (A size adjective tells you how big or small something is) Examples: large, tiny, enormous, little □ Age Examples: ancient, new, young, old Shape Examples: square, round, flat, rectangular Color Examples: blue, pink, reddish, gray Origin Examples: Mexican, Chinese, eastern, northern, lunar, solar Material Examples: wooden, metal, cotton, paper, stone Purpose (These adjectives often end with "-ing") Examples: sleeping (as in "sleeping bag"), roasting (as in "roasting pan")
